Helpful Entry Tips

- Tell your story. Use images and graphics and provide examples to highlight your success.
- Answer clearly and concisely, and make sure you answer the question.
- Bullet points are great. Be concise.
- Don't assume that judges will have any prior knowledge of your business. They may not be local.
- Include data and evidence, because doing so ensures credibility and believability.
- Attend a workshop to chat through the process with the Chamber awards team. Workshop dates on Page 4.
- Involve your team in the process they will have ideas you may not have thought of.

Timaru District Council/Venture Timaru Emerging Business Award

Commercial Business trading less than 3 years.

DB Draught Brewery Small Business Award

Commercial Business with 1 - 5 FTE.

Oceania Dairy Medium Business Award

Commercial Business with 6 - 15 FTE.

Stuff/Timaru Herald Large Business Award

Commercial Business with 16+ FTE.

PrimePort Timaru Excellence in Primary Industry Award

Recognises the achievements of businesses involved in the production and processing of primary goods, agribusiness, horticulture, beef, sheep, cropping, fisheries and or forestry sector.

Fairlie Bakehouse Community Award

Recognises N.F.P. organisations that make a significant contribution to the community.

Environment Canterbury Sustainability and Environmental Award

Recognises any company, organisation, farm, community group or school, that is focusing on managing and enhancing the environment and/or sustainability through economic, social, cultural, or environmental protection.

2degrees Innovation Award

Recognises innovative practices in the day to day running of your business/organisation and how this contributes to productivity, creativity and profitability.

Supporting Local Award

Recognises a business, group or project/initiative in our community that demonstrates commitment and involvement to enhancing and supporting the South Canterbury community. The entry may be in areas such as culture, education, health or welfare and one-off projects.

Alpine Energy Excellence in Workplace Safety Award

Recognises exemplary approach to workplace health and safety. Awarded to a business/organisation with a culture of workplace safety embedded in everyday practice.

Presbyterian Support South Canterbury Good Sorts Award

Recognises an individual in our community who goes above and beyond to help others. Someone who is making a difference in our community and working to improve our local community, workplaces, or homes.

ANZ People's Choice Award

All finalists are automatically inculded in this award. It is voted online by the public through the website www.southcanterbury.org.nz

Forsyth Barr Special Commendation

Recognises a business or individual leader of the business community who has done exemplary work and has made a significant contribution to the business and wider community. Selected by the Chamber Board.

Supreme Award

Supreme Award voted by the judges from all award winners.

Things you need to know

When do entries close?

Entry forms must be completed and submitted by 12 noon, Friday, 7 June 2024.

Entry is free and open to all businesses and Not-for-Profit organisations in South Canterbury.

You do not need to be a South Canterbury Chamber member to enter. If part of a larger organisation, a business must be able to demonstrate that the South Canterbury branch operates as a separate business unit.

How many awards can a business enter?

Businesses may enter as many awards as they like. Many businesses will be eligible for multiple awards. All award winners are automatically eligible for the Supreme Business & Community Excellence Award except those in The Good Sorts Award and the Special Commendation.

How many copies do I need to provide?

You are asked to provide 5 copies of your entry and an electronic copy. No USBs will be accepted. Please email your electronic copy to awards@scchamber.org.nz and post or deliver your paper entries to the address on page 8.

Workshops are scheduled to help you with your entry and chat with the Chamber BCEA team. Dates for these are listed on the Website and on page 4 of this brochure. Although optional, these are recommended.

Can I submit further information with my entry?

Your entry should be submitted within the specified word limit. Additional information in the form of images, graphics and examples may be included to highlight your success.

A business must disclose any issues that may compromise the integrity of the awards or cause a business/organisation to discontinue in the next year.

A mystery shopper process will be conducted for all finalists and this mark is included in the final score. Sustainability and Environmental Award finalists will receive a site visit as part of the judging process. Good Sorts Award finalists are not included in the Mystery Shopper process.

When are the finalists announced?

Finalists are announced on Friday 12 July and all finalists need to be available to attend the Awards ceremony in Timaru on Friday 16 August, 2024. Finalists and winners agree to being involved in publicity related to the awards.

Judging scores remain confidential and no correspondence will be entered into regarding the outcome of the awards. Entrants must score over 60% to become a finalist. Judges will be listed on the South Canterbury website. Judges comments and feedback will be provided to all entrants following the Awards Gala event.

The South Canterbury Chamber of Commerce reserves the right to decline an entry.

All entries are treated as confidential by the Chamber awards team and are not returned to the entrants at the conclusion of the awards.

Previous Supreme winners of the Business & Community Excellence Awards are not eligible to enter the awards for two years following their win of the Supreme Award. They may enter again in the third year following.
